#### 8.C PRECEPT

Documents were circulated prior to the meeting.

The Clerk said the projected income for 2023-24 is £593,707 this includes the precept of £530,657 which has been agreed by Shropshire Council at the end of December. The expenditure budget for 2023-24 is £619,470, which leaves a shortfall of £25,763.

Members were asked to consider either keeping the precept as it is with a 0% increase, based on a Band D tax rate, with the shortfall being paid for out of General Reserves or raising the precept to cover all or part of the shortfall.

The Mayor said Councils General Reserves are in danger of falling below the recommended amount as a result of additional funding being allocated to Market Drayton Sports Association. A precept increase of 3% is necessary to ensure the running of the Council is maintained; he asked for members comments.

Councillor Manton said due to the cost-of-living crisis it is a difficult conversation to have; he agreed with the Council supporting the sports facility within the town however the precept affects everyone and the maximum increase if any should be 2%.

Councillor Aldcroft said he agrees with the Mayor; the precept should be increased to cover all the added costs Town Council are picking up from Shropshire Council such as maintaining street furniture, street cleaning and to ensure floral displays can be maintained throughout the town.

Councillor T. Beckett said Shropshire Council are considering charging Council's for road closures for events such as the festival of lights; this would be an added burden on the Councils budget.

Councillor Whittle proposed, Councillor Aldcroft seconded, and it was RESOLVED:

To agree a 3% increase on the precept for 2023-24.

The precept to be £549,579.

The shortfall in budget of £9,841 to come out of General Reserves.

# 9.C SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL BUDGET REVIEW CONSULTATION

### 11.C SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL UPDATES

Councillor Aldcroft announced that he has been poorly throughout December and has not attended any Shropshire Council meetings so has nothing to report back to members.

Councillor Nellins reported:

### Budget review consultation

For every £5 in Shropshire Councils budget, £4 is spent on disadvantage people. All departments have been asked to look at their budget to see if any savings can be made; the reductions this will not affect the delivery of services. Shropshire Council has statutory services that they have to provide; those do not include providing services such as libraries and sports facilities. He urged all members to have a look at the consultation papers and submit their comments.

#### Floods

The River Severn water level is high and is expected to rise even more; all barriers have been put in place and a number of roads around the County have been closed due to surface flooding; it has caused a lot of work and funding has had to be used.

#### Single journey bus service

Under a Government initiative submitted by Commercial Enterprise at Shropshire Council bus journeys cost no more than £2 for a single trip until the 31 March; the bus route 64 is included in this scheme. He urged people to use the service to increase the amount of people using it.

Currently there are only four bus routes within the County that pay their way: routes are funded by Shropshire Council for this financial year.

A demand response bus service is being trialled in Shrewsbury; if this is successful it will be extended throughout the County.

#### A529 safety road works

There are safety improvement works being carried out to maintain the existing roads and footpaths and upgrade street lighting, the road will be closed for nineteen days between Great Hales Street and Phoenix Bank River Tern crossing from Monday 30 January to Friday 17 February. During this time signed diversions will be in place. Initial: W.W....
