Located in North Shropshire, Market Drayton is a traditional Shropshire market town with origins dating back to before the Domesday Book. In 1245 King Henry III granted a charter for a weekly Wednesday market, giving Market Drayton its current name.

Flanked by gentle waterways and sweeping farmland, Market Drayton has a wealth of riches to discover, the town is a historical treasure trove, streets have historic character with a mix of half-timber, Georgian and Victorian buildings. You will receive a warm welcome in our friendly pubs and shops, all for you to explore.

Market Drayton is easy to access by car, just off the scenic A53, there are plenty of parking opportunities in the centre of town. We are also served by the regular 64 bus service and is mid-way between Stoke-on-Trent and Shrewsbury, this service will drop visitors off within a stone's throw of the Town Centre so visitors can enjoy trouble free access to what the Town has to offer.

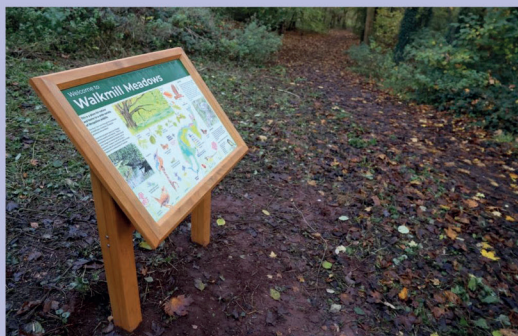

Walkmill Meadows

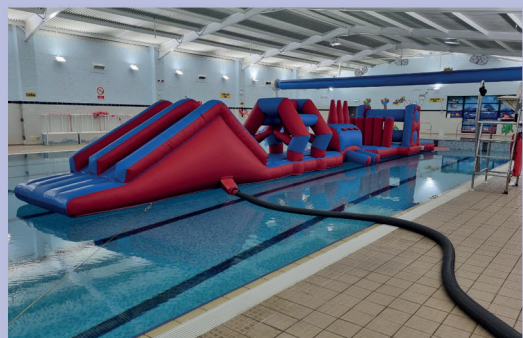
